Below is the recorded phone message that I recently sent regarding our upcoming school closure:

Good afternoon everyone,

This is Brad Ebert, Superintendent of the Kiel Area School District, calling with a cancellation related announcement.

Today Governor Evers announced a ban on all gatherings of 50 people or more people. He did say that the ban would not affect services such as grocery stores, food pantries, childcare centers, pharmacies and hospitals. Schools are no longer exempt from this ban and to ensure the safety of our students and staff, school will be closed beginning tomorrow, Tuesday, March 17th through April 5, 2020.

Teachers did their best to communicate with all students today regarding the digital learning plan going forward and parents and students should watch for future communications from those teachers. Please remember that the digital learning plan that you received yesterday via email will begin on Monday, March 23, 2020.

Please be sure to check your email this evening for future details.

During this time, we will do everything we can to provide your children with a positive learning experience.

Hello Everyone,

I hope you are all doing well this evening.

As promised, I am outlining our plan for digital learning as we prepare to close down our schools as directed.

I want to begin by sharing with you once again that we are in constant contact with our school nurse, the county health department, Center for Disease Control and the Governor's office regarding updates surrounding the Coronavirus. We will continue to follow the state mandates and the advice of our county health department and the CDC regarding our area. At this time, we will be in session Monday through Wednesday of this week and all buildings will be closed at 5 pm on Wednesday. Please know that this is subject to change if we are directed to close by any of the agencies mentioned above.

It is really important that I let you know that if you as parents are not comfortable sending your children to school during this time, the school district will support your ability to keep them home and they will not be penalized for their absences.

Below I am outlining the plan for our digital learning during the time when school is closed:

The Kiel Area School District will have students in session from Monday, March 16th to Wednesday, March 18th.

After Wednesday students will not be allowed into the school building until at least April 6th. With this, students will be expected to bring all materials and personal belongings home by Wednesday, March 18th. Through this effort to remove all student items, cleaning staff will continue efforts to disinfect and deep clean the school.

Thursday and Friday, parents of students in grades 3 through 7 will be able to check out their child's Chromebook at their respective school.

Buildings will be open on Thursday from 8 am to 6 pm and Friday from 8 am to 4 pm; parents are directed to go to the office and they will guide you to the Chromebook pick up station...details on returning the Chromebooks will be shared with you when school resumes. Please know that checking out a Chromebook is optional, as I know that many families have devices that students are able to access.

If your household does not have Internet access please contact Charter Spectrum for a no-cost, 60-day access to High Speed Internet. Please contact 1-844-488-8395. Installation fees will be waived for new student households. Comcast is also offering free 60-day access.

Chromebooks will be monitored at all times for content and search history. All Chromebooks will continue to have a school-based filter limiting access to certain web content.

Further details and instructions will be provided by classroom teachers as we move along through the Google Classroom platform for grades 3-12.

4K-2nd grade teachers will be providing print resources that have directions already attached that teachers will be putting together and sending home.

On Monday, March 23rd, students will begin accessing learning from home (digital learning), established via Google Classroom and teacher-instructed curriculum. Further details and instructions will be provided to parents and students individually by classroom teachers through the Google Classroom platform and other means. eSchool students will continue to progress in their classwork through the eSchool platforms.

Finally, classes will resume April 6th at the earliest. Once again, that decision will be based on the recommendations from the agencies mentioned above. At no time during the district shutdown will students be allowed into the school building. Please continue to check the school website, Facebook, and School Messenger notification system to ensure up-to-date information regarding the school closure.

I will do everything I can to continue to provide you with information as we move along.

Good Evening Everyone,

I am writing today to provide an update regarding the Coronavirus and the recent school closing announcement made by Governor Tony Evers.

Late this afternoon, Governor Evers announced that all Wisconsin schools will be closed as of 5 pm Wednesday, March 18th and will reopen as of the start of the school day on April 6th.

Some news outlets reported this date incorrectly. I have verified with the Department of Public Instruction and the Governor's office that the closing time and date is 5pm on Wednesday the 18th.

With that said, students and staff will still report to school Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of next week.

When school closes as of 5 pm on Wednesday, ALL school related events and practices will be cancelled and all district facilities will be closed until April 6th.

We will continue to work through the weekend and early next week to address a number of things across our district, including the following:

- Digital Learning possibilities
- Meals for those that may not have them during the closed time

- Potential day care possibilities for parents that need to work
- Cleaning of our buildings, etc.
- Extracurricular events taking place after April 6th
- State testing, etc.

I will continue to communicate with you through email or phone as we go along. Thank you so much for your words of encouragement and thank you for your patience as we continue to work through this very difficult and evolving situation.
