We are also proud to have partnered with the Kohler Corporation in regards to the two projects that are happening at Kiel High School (building a new athletic complex and performing arts center). Kohler Corporation has agreed to donate nearly 25,000 dollars of plumbing equipment that includes sinks, toilets, etc. This partnership is the just the beginning of the many partnerships we hope to continue to build with our businesses. Next year as part of our strategic plan, we will begin to enhance our business partnerships, increase trades opportunities for students, offer more higher level and dual credit courses and expand personalized learning opportunities for our students; there will be plenty of opportunities for businesses to partner with us.

The athletic complex renovation began last week with a groundbreaking ceremony in which hundreds of students, parents, community supporters and community members gathered together to officially begin the project. The start of this project signifies a major "win for kids." Our goal is to keep winning for kids!

The financial and other specifics of the performing arts center are being finalized at this time, including another review of the best possible location site for this new complex. On May 28th at 6 pm at Kiel High School, the school board has invited the community to attend an informational session which will review the progress of what will be a beautiful and much needed performing arts center for our students and community to use. All are welcome to attend!

We also celebrated "Staff Appreciation Week" during the month of May. We celebrated our staff by providing meals and treats for them, painting windows around town thanking them and sharing "thank you" cards with them, etc. I know our hard working Parent Teacher Associations, students and community members worked exceptionally hard to share with teachers how much they are appreciated. Please join me as we continue to say "thank you" to our teachers not only during Staff Appreciation Week, but every chance we get, as they truly hold the future of our children in their hands! Let's also remember to thank all others that serve our communities and keep us safe, such as police officers, fire fighters, military personnel, etc.
